



Safeguarding Statement for Families and Children

What Is Safeguarding and Why Do We Do It?

Safeguarding is any action taken to protect children (those under 18), and adults (those aged 18 or over) at risk (as defined in the Care Act 2014) from harm, whilst supporting their wellbeing and welfare. We will always safeguard the people we have contact with.

Safeguarding is something that we take seriously because we believe in supporting the wellbeing of others as well as their education.

How Do We Safeguard Children and Adults at risk?

BA Tuition Ltd have tutors who stay up to date with safeguarding laws and guidance. Every tutor currently working for us has criminal background checks and enhanced DBS checks. Any future employees of BA Tuition Ltd would have overseas police check too if they have lived abroad in the last 5 years.

When we work with our clients, we make sure they are familiar with this safeguarding statement and our safeguarding policy. All tutors are capable of effectively communicating any concerns if they need to.

Who Might We Contact About Concerns?

If we have genuine concerns for the safety or welfare of a child or adult at risk, we may need to seek advice on how to best support them, which could mean contacting other official services (e.g. the police or local authority safeguarding teams). We cannot promise to keep anything a secret when it concerns safety, but only because we care about the wellbeing of our tutees and their families.
